While this is the least expensive option, it will require a bit of elbow grease and the moving of furniture.

HOW TO AVOID BEING "RIPPED OFF!"

Sadly, like many industries nowadays, carpet cleaning has had it's fair share of "cowboys" and their scams. Be cautious of any company that appears on your doorstep uninvited or contacts you out of the blue over the phone. Also, be wary of companies that advertise a cleaning price by the room. Rooms are different sizes and the charge should be based on the amount of carpet cleaned,

The two most popular doing the "rounds" at the moment are Bait & Switch and the Splash & Dash. A company based in the South was shown using these methods on BBC's Watchdog program.

Bait & Switch

You get a leaflet through your door advertising carpet cleaning at ridiculously low prices, i.e. a lounge cleaned for £20 or a whole house for £100. (we've even seen one for only £9 a room) **This is the Bait!**

You ring and book them to do the job. They arrive and start cleaning straight away. No inspection and survey. No pre-vacuuming (which is a must) and no written confirmation of the price.

Now the Switch.

Once they've made your carpet wet they point out that furniture must be moved (extra charge) traffic lanes are very dirty and need a double clean (extra charge) spot clean (extra charge) and so on.

When the work has been done (badly) you are presented with your invoice, including the extras. Your £20 carpet has now become £200 and I'm afraid people pay them. The biggest surprise? (Not) it's nearly always the elderly they target.

Splash & Dash

As the name suggests, they're in and out before you know it. It is similar to bait & switch, but this time they just want to clean as much as they can in as little time as possible and move on to the next job.

Splash & Dash is a carpet cleaning industry term for unprofessional, untrained and usually uninsured "carpet cleaners" with non-professional equipment and cleaning solutions, limiting the cleaning results and potentially damaging/shrinking your carpets in the process.

A cheap clean could result in major damage to your furnishings that would cost you more in the long run. Best to play safe and get a professional in to do the job for you.





FIVE COSTLY MISCONCEPTIONS

You should wait as long as possible to have your carpets cleaned!

No, dirt is an abrasive, like sandpaper. Every time you step on it you grind and rub the dirt into the fibres. The longer you wait to have your carpets cleaned, the more damage you do and it will wear much faster.

The only reason to clean carpets is to remove dirt!

No, dirt is only one of the reasons for cleaning. Outdoor air contains pollens, fungus, bacteria, pollution and hundreds of other chemicals. When you come indoors, you carry these things in your hair, on your shoes and on your clothing. Not surprisingly, these things end up on your furnishings and in your carpets.

Did you know that many allergies and breathing problems stem from home? Did you also know that there is now an anti-allergen protector on the market that practically eliminates Dust Mites from your carpets?

One carpet cleaning method is as good as another!

No! There are two main cleaning methods, Hot Water Extraction and Dry cleaning but one is far more effective than the other. **The least effective way of cleaning is using the Dry Cleaning method.** This is where dry chemicals, foam or compound are used to clean your carpet, but it is not rinsed in any way. (would you clean your hair without rinsing it out after?)

Dry compound is spread on your carpet and then machine brushed into it before being removed. This method is effective, but can cause damage to the fibres. Would you run a stiff brush through your lovely carpets? The only reason Dry Cleaning should be used is if you have natural carpeting such as Coir, Sisal etc. this method is paramount as wet cleaning will cause damage.

Have a look through your local Yellow Pages directory and see how many carpet cleaners use this Dry Cleaning technique. In Leicestershire, it's about 2% or so. If the Dry Cleaning system is that good, why aren't we all using it?

This leaves us with **the most effective cleaning method** - **HOT WATER EXTRACTION!**The basic principle of this system is that a pre-treatment is applied to the vacuumed carpet by hand held sprayer and agitated with a hand pile brush. After a short period of dwell time, a rinsing solution is then sprayed into the carpet fibres through a series of spray jets at very high pressure.

This loosens the soiling which is then sucked back into the machine by a powerful vacuum shoe immediately behind the jets into a waste recovery tank. The power of the machine being used determines the cleanliness and dryness of your carpets, and this method is the most effective carpet cleaning procedure, but ONLY when used by certified, professional carpet cleaners!



Always hire the cheapest company!

You and I are probably quite similar. . . We both like finding a bargain, and what appears to be a "great deal" can sometimes be hard to resist. But be warned . . . for some things in life, buying cheap isn't always best because if things go wrong, the consequences are not pleasant. Would you let a bloke from the pub cut your hair if it was 50% cheaper than a professional? So why do the same with your carpets/furnishings!

An honest carpet cleaner should be able to give me a price over the phone! I wish this were true, but it isn't. Honest, reputable carpet cleaning companies almost never price by the room. Instead, carpet cleaning is usually priced by the square foot or metre. (If they're guessing your room sizes, what else are they guessing?) To get an exact price each area needs to be measured exactly before considering other additional factors such as:

- (a) The type of carpet. Certain types of carpet are harder to clean than others.
- (b) The amount of soiling. Carpet that hasn't been cleaned for 10 years will take longer than a carpet that was cleaned within the last year.
- (c) <u>Stain removal.</u> If there are stains that will need treating separately certain chemicals will be needed and you need to establish how long it may take for the stain to be removed.
- (d) The amount of furniture needed to be moved.

Then, and only then, a written quotation should be given with the exact full price you would have to pay.
